

A place anyone can report suspected or actual abuse, or neglect of adults.



Adult Safeguarding Unit

- >1,470 calls 1 July 2020 to 30 April 2021
- >725 calls for advice and information, 745 were reports, requiring further action by the ASU
- >Continuing role in raising awareness of strategies to safeguard the rights of older people and people with a disability, at risk of abuse

1 in 20 Australians experience some form of abuse from a person they know and trust



IN SOUTH AUSTRALIA

50% of cases are financial abuse

75% of cases are emotional abuse

80% of abuse is by a family member



% of victims live in the family home

COVID-19 Aged Care Response

>Office for Ageing Well – leading South Australia's COVID-19 aged care response

>Collaborative approach to issues relevant to aged care that relate to preparedness and/or response to COVID-19 outbreaks

>Feedback and advice in relation to legal directions, planning or activity related to COVID-19 outbreaks in residential aged care

 >Development of resources to support the South Australian aged care sector
 >Work is ongoing



Royal Commission into Aged Care

- >Australian Government provided its response to the Royal Commission recommendations – accepting 126 of the 148 recommendations either entirely or in-principle.
- >Key highlights include:
 - A human rights focus
 - New Act; introduction of a single assessment workforce – combining RAS and ACAP
 - 'Ageing in place' additional \$6.8 billion for 80,000 additional home care packages across Australia
 - Graded assessments and performance rating for RACF will be introduced via a star rating system.

> The State Government will continue to monitor the impact of the 'Respect Care and Dignity Generational Plan for Aged Care in Australia' on South Australia
